HONORING OUR HEROES

Part of Route 41 (Gap-Newport Pike) in Cochranville is now known as the Corporal Brandon Hardy Memorial Highway, named in honor of a soldier from the Octorara area who gave his life in service to our nation in Iraq in 2006. Senator Comitta, who introduced Act 17 of 2023 enacting the road dedication, was joined by the Hardy family, military officials, and community members to unveil the new sign. Located along Octorara High School, the road commemorates Corporal Hardy and honors all those who answer the call of duty.



COMMUNITY REVITALIZATION

Senator Comitta is investing in the community organizations and programs that make a positive difference in the lives of local seniors, workers, and families. She secured \$100,000 in state funding for a new commercial kitchen at Brandywine Valley Active Aging's

Coatesville Campus, \$50,000 for a new van for the Chester County OIC, and millions more to prevent homelessness, promote affordable housing, and support job and career readiness programs.

PROTECTING OUR PETS

Senator Comitta holds a rescue puppy from the Brandywine Valley SPCA. In addition to securing \$50,000 in state funding for upgrades to the nonprofit organization's West Chester shelter, Comitta has introduced the Dog and Cat Protection Act to encourage pet adoption and prevent animal cruelty, as well as Senate Bill 1178 to prohibit medically unnecessary cat declawing. PROMOTING LITERACY AND EDUCATION

Imagination Library statewide. The free program mails high-quality ageappropriate books to all registered children, from birth to age 5, at no cost to the child's family each month. Comitta is also working to secure \$50,000 in state funding for Arts Holding Hands and Hearts, which administers the program to nearly 8,500 children in Chester County.



HEALTHY COMMUNITIES AND FAMILIES

Access to quality, affordable healthcare is a cornerstone of our communities. Senator Comitta is helping lead the effort to:

- Expand Post-Partum Care: Mothers on Medicaid are now covered for one year following the birth of a baby (instead of just 60 days).
- Invest in Community Services: Securing \$50,000 for the Maternal and Child Health Consortium to provide one-on-one support throughout a pregnancy.
- Reduce Maternal Mortality:
 Most pregnancy-related deaths are preventable. A new law (Act 5 of 2023) improves data collection and tracking to help save lives.
- Empower Doulas: Creating a certification process for doulas and supporting coverage for doula services.
- Fight Breast Cancer: Act 1 of 2023 eliminates all costs associated with screenings and genetic testing for high-risk individuals. Senator Comitta is also bringing back \$50,000 for Unite for HER, a nonprofit offering breast cancer support services.



Dozens of moms, children, and families attended Senator Comitta's Community Baby Shower in Coatesville. The free event connected new and expectant mothers with nearly 30 local community organizations and the invaluable resources they offer.

Protect Reproductive Freedom:
 Abortion remains safe and legal in Pennsylvania. Senator Comitta is working to keep it that way by defending access to reproductive care, contraception, and the freedom to make our own healthcare choices.

SAFE SCHOOLS AND NEIGHBORHOODS

When she was Mayor of West Chester, Senator Comitta launched initiatives to prevent violence and bring people together. Today, she continues to prioritize public safety and strengthen our emergency services so we all can live in peace. She is working to:

- Support Student Health and Wellness: Putting more nurses and counselors in schools and establishing a voluntary pilot program to help students struggling with depression.
- Invest in Our EMS Infrastructure: Securing \$450,000 for eight ambulance and emergency services providers. Investing \$20,000 to update and expand communications for Avon Grove Regional Emergency Management.
- Prevent Medical Emergencies:
 Teaching students CPR, training teachers to respond to seizures, and securing state funding to put new automated external defibrillators in every public school in Chester County.
- Promote Community Policing:
 Convening a gathering of local police chiefs and supporting funding for hundreds of new state troopers.
- Save Lives and Fight Addiction: Distributing Naloxone and training residents, families, and employers on using it to reverse an opioid overdose.


- Stand Up to Hate: Supporting funding for security improvements at local synagogues, mosques, churches, and other communities at risk of being targeted.
- Stop Discrimination: Enshrining marriage equality into state law and protecting LGBTQ+ students from discrimination.
- End Gun Violence: Supporting measures to keep guns out of the wrong hands, like universal background checks and safe, secure firearm storage programs.

PROTECTING ALL CREATURES GREAT AND SMALL

The beauty of nature is how it works together. Pollinators are vital to our economy and agricultural industry.

Other insects are an important food source for birds and small animals. However, an estimated 40 percent of insect species are in decline and a third are endangered due to climate change, habitat loss, and other factors.

How Can You Help?

Limit Light Pollution: Excessive over-lighting can harm insects and wildlife by disrupting their behavior and exposing them to predators. It can also negatively impact our health and sleep patterns. Please follow these tips from Dark Sky International to ensure outdoor lighting is:

- Shielded and directed only where needed.
- No brighter than necessary and used only when needed.
- Consistent with warmer color lights.

Let it Grow: Frequent mowing can destroy eggs, larvae, and food sources for developing insects. Consider converting a portion of your lawn to a meadow to increase biodiversity in your backyard.

- Plant wildflowers and native species to create a pollinator habitat or sanctuary for birds, bugs, fireflies, and other creatures.
- Be cautious of the potential for ticks (and the diseases they carry) in wooded areas and high grass.

Skip Pesticides and Herbicides: Many pesticides – including insecticides, fungicides, and herbicides – harm pollinators and other beneficial insects while also posing a threat to us and our pets.

 Consider using more environmentally friendly and less toxic alternatives.
